MEDICAL AND DENTAL

The agencies listed provide limited medical and dental services to seniors and persons with disabilities who are unable to afford these services. Please carefully read the eligibility requirements of each program to see if you qualify.

The QUEST Integration program provides health care coverage as well as home and community based services to Hawaii residents who are eligible for Medicaid. In-home services include chore, personal care, and personal emergency response systems. Community based services include adult day care, adult day health, skilled nursing, and residential care. (*Government Agency*)

MEDICARE Insurance (Medical)

Medicare is a federal health insurance program for seniors 65 years or older and for individuals with end stage renal disease or other disabilities. If you qualify for Social Security disability benefits, you will also qualify for Medicare to cover your medical expenses. A person with disabilities will automatically get Part A and Part B after you get disability benefits from Social Security for 24 months. If you have ALS, you automatically get Part A and Part B the month your disability benefits begin. (*Government Agency*)

Partnership for Prescription Assistance (PPA) – Hawaii (Medical) https://hi.pparx.org/ (apply online)

The Partnership for Prescription Assistance helps qualifying patients without prescription drug coverage get the medicines they need through the program that is right for them – free of charge. Many patients will get their medications at no cost or at discounted prices. A patient or patient advocate simply completes our online application with basic information about prescription medicines, income, and current prescription medicine coverage and the PPA matches the patient with assistance programs for which they may be eligible.
